ABOUT BTO YOUTH

BTO Youth is the youth branch of the British Trust for Ornithology (BTO). BTO is a UK charity focusing on understanding birds and, in particular, how and why bird populations are changing. Our vision is of a world where people are inspired by birds and informed by science. Our Youth programme aims to engage young people with nature and science in a safe, inclusive and accessible way.



ABOUT SBO



Spurn Bird Observatory was founded in 1945 to monitor migration through this hotspot on the East Yorkshire Coast. We have hostel style accommodation at the Observatory for up to 13 people and employ a full time Warden who regularly catches birds as part of the BTO ringing scheme. During the summer months we employ several wardens to monitor the Little Tern colony and we have a wide range of volunteers monitoring the migration in the area.



WHY TAKE THE COURSE?

The Young Leaders course is aimed at those young people who want to make a difference for the natural world and for people. The course focuses on skills that will help you advance as a leader. These include practical skills, such as how to run successful guided activities or meetings, but also theoretical skills such as management styles and partnership working.

The programme will see you meet a variety of leaders from across the ornithological sector. The course will be hosted by a mixture of staff from BTO Youth and Spurn Bird Observatory. The programme may change depending on weather, but will include sessions on:

Negotiating and influencing: how to use a leadership position to affect positive change.

Guiding events: from bird walks to debates, how do you run and organise a safe and inclusive event?

Networking: put into practice some of the theory around networking in an interactive activity.

Building a community: how do you bring together a variety of stakeholders for the greater good?

Working in partnership: understanding the importance of working together in the sector.

Practical skills: such as running successful meetings, making presentations, and writing CVs.



HOW TO APPLY

Just follow the instructions on the form! You can either complete it digitally, or print it and send it back. **Think outside the box; the leader you choose, for example, does not have to be a conservationist.** If you need any help with your application you can always email us.

WHO CAN APPLY?

The course is open to young people, resident in the UK, who are:

- At the time of the course, 16 to 24 (inclusive) years old.
- Passionate about making a positive difference in the conservation and/or environmental sector.

WHERE AND WHEN IS THE COURSE?

The course will take place at the amazing Spurn Bird Observatory. The course will start on **Wednesday 10 August at 12:00**. We advise that you arrive a bit before then and staff will be available from 11:00 onwards to welcome you on site. The programme will run until **14:00 on Saturday 13 August**. The Observatory is booked for a private event from 16:00 onwards so we ask that you make sure to leave the Observatory before then.

If you are travelling from further afield to attend the course, we may be able to reserve a bed for you in the Observatory for the evening of the 9th of August. If this would be helpful for you, please indicate this on the application form, but note that we can only accommodate those that could not feasibly travel down in time for the 12:00 start on the Wednesday.



COST + EQUIPMENT



The course is completely **free of charge**. It is important to us that anyone can access the resources they need to develop their leadership skills. We do ask that, by applying, you commit to taking your place if you are successful in your application as we will have fewer spaces than applicants.

You do not need to bring much to the course; you may find it helpful to bring a **laptop** if you have one, and **binoculars** as it is a fantastic place for birdwatching. We will provide notebooks, pens, and spare binoculars as well. Please note this is **not** a birdwatching course, and so this will not be the focus of the activities.

GETTING TO SPURN

Spurn is reachable by public transport via Hull, taking the bus to either Patrington or Easington. There is also ample parking for those driving.

If travel expenses are a barrier to you, please indicate this on your application. We have a limited number of travel bursaries available.

ACCOMMODATION

Accommodation will be in the Observatory, which has luxury shared dormitories available. You will be required to share with up to three other course members. At least one fully DBS-checked staff member will be in the building at all times overnight.

SAFEGUARDING

Safeguarding participants is of paramount importance to us. All of our core staff will have completed safeguarding training and will be DBS checked and cleared. A Designated Safeguarding Lead will be present. BTO's Safeguarding Policy can be found on our website or by email our team at youth@bto.org. We will also complete a full risk assessment before the start of course, including a COVID-19 risk assessment taking into consideration the most current advice from Government.
